



Possessive case - Possessive adjectives / pronouns

Grammar

Possessive Case

We use the Possessive Case 's to show that something belongs to a person or an animal.

We form the Possessive Case:

- by adding 's to singular nouns.
 e.g. This is the girl's cat.
- by adding ' to regular plural nouns.
 e.g. The boys' hats are blue.
- by adding. 's to irregular plural nouns.
 e.g. Those are the children's toys.

Whose ...?

- We use whose to ask who something belongs to.
 - e.g. Whose book is this? It's Penny's (book).

- We use Possessive Adjectives to show who something belongs to.
- Possessive Adjectives always go before nouns and don't take an article.
- e.g. Sam has got a car. His car is red.

Grammar Possessive Pronouns

- We use Possessive Pronouns to show who something belongs to.
- Possessive Pronouns are never followed by a noun, while possessive adjectives are always followed by a noun.
 - e.g. This is my book. BUT This book is mine.
