

Guide to writing

- When writing a review, be specific because the reader may not be familiar with the restaurant/café/book/play/ film you are describing.
- Make a plan before you begin writing.
- Decide whether your review will be positive, negative or balanced.
- Remember to include all the necessary basic information. Refer to the plan on page 73 and make comments
 about significant features such as: food, price, service, atmosphere, décor (for a restaurant/café)/plot and setting,
 actors/protagonists and their performance/role (for a film/play/book); mention other features such as size of
 portions, hygiene (for a restaurant/café)/music, special effects (for a film/play)/length, style of writing (for a book).
- Do not include too many details. For a film/play/book mention only the main points of the plot and do not reveal the ending.
- Include your comments in a separate paragraph and don't forget to justify your ideas.
- Pay attention to tenses. For a restaurant/café use the Present Simple for references concerning the fixed features
 of the establishment such as décor, and the Past Simple for comments that reflect your personal opinion on
 aspects such as the food and service. For a film/play/book use the Present Simple when describing the plot.
- Use a wide range of vocabulary to make your review interesting. You can also use questions and exclamation marks.
- Use set phrases/expressions in your review. Look at the tables for ideas.


