

### Time Clauses



### **Time Clauses**

- Time clauses begin with when, after, before, as soon as, until, etc.
- When the sentence refers to the future, we usually use the **Present Simple** in the time clause and **Future** *will* in the main clause.

Time clauses	Main clauses
As soon as it gets dark,	we'll go home.
Before Richard goes to the gym,	he'll wash his car.

When the time clause comes before the main clause, the two clauses are separated by a comma.

### be able to

Look at the picture and read the dialogue.



- **A:** I think some time in the future people will be able to live on another planet.
- **B:** Maybe, but first they should find a suitable planet. They **won't be able to live** on a planet without oxygen.

### be able to

- We usually use **can** to express ability in the present. The baby can speak.
- We usually use **could** to express ability in the past. 
  I could climb trees when I was young.
- **Be able to** expresses ability and forms all tenses. It is mainly used in tenses where we cannot use **can**. *Jack will be able to play football on Saturday. He's feeling better.*

### NOTE

**Could** expresses general ability in the past.

Was/were able to expresses ability in a particular situation in the past.

I could draw well at the age of five.

The firefighters were able to put out the fire after two hours.

The firefighters could put out the fire after two hours.

**But** There is no difference in meaning between **could** and **was/were able to** when used in the negative.
